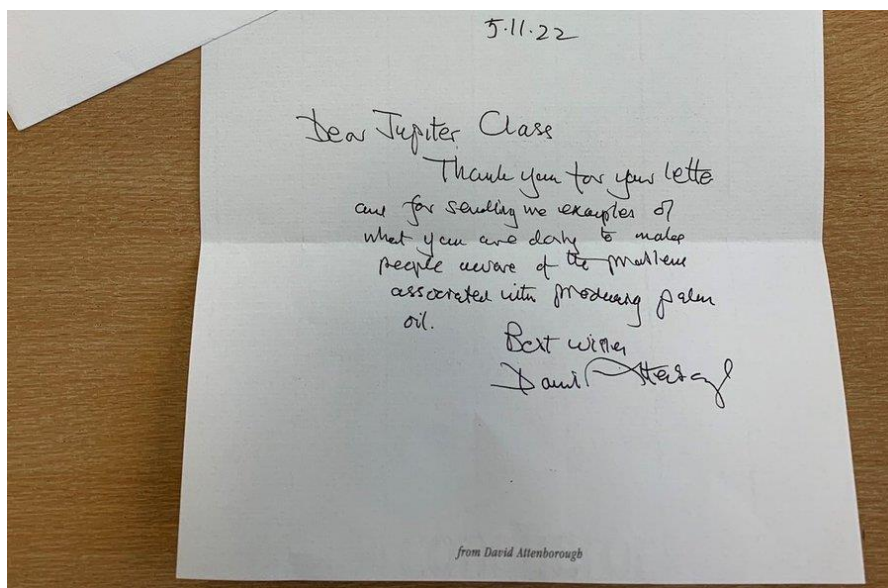
"Leaders have put their vision in action by making the decision to convert to an academy, choosing a multi-academy trust whose values are clearly aligned with their own".
